### Sopwith Pup - Biplane

Most World War One aircraft had two sets of wings like the Sopwith Pup drawn above. This gave the aircraft more lift and made it easier for the pilot to change direction - which was very important in dogfights. The downside was that biplanes were slower in the air than monoplanes (single wing aircraft).
